



**The Conservatives of All Colors Internship Program  
Summer 2020 Session Program Overview  
FAQ**

**Who**

The program is available to ethnic-minority students at least 18 years of age currently enrolled in a post-secondary college or university or who have graduated within the past five years.

**When**

The 2020 summer session begins June 8 and runs through July 24.

**Where**

All participants in the 2020 summer session will be interning with legislative representatives or policy analysis/think tank firms in Washington D.C.

Interns who do not reside in the Washington D.C. metropolitan area may take advantage of POCC Interns' housing agreement with George Washington University. POCC Interns has reserved a block of dorm rooms which are available on a first-come-first-served basis at no cost to the interns. Interns who will be living in the GWU dormitories should plan to arrive at GWU after 3:00pm on June 7 and must exit the dormitory by 10:00am on July 25. Travel reimbursement to and from Washington D.C. is also available up to \$500.

In addition to providing housing and travel allowance POCC Interns summer session positions are paid internships. Interns will be compensated \$1500 for the seven week term.

**What**

In addition to daily responsibilities in the host member's office we anticipate multiple excursions and activities exclusively for POCC Interns. These include a tours of federal buildings, meetings with key staff and government officials, tours of federal agencies and other events.

**How**

Prospective interns should submit an application which can be found at [www.poccinterns.com](http://www.poccinterns.com) along with a resume. Initial interviews will be scheduled November/December of 2019. Successful completion of this step will result in secondary interviews with prospective Congressional host member's Chief of Staff or other office responsible party.

Interns will be responsible for their own meals, daily transportation to/from Capitol Hill and other incidental expenses.
